ECOM Position on PrEP

- PrEP should be available for gay men and other MSM, and transgender people
- PrEP should be funded by national budget; option of selffunding by users must be available
- PrEP should be a subject of close collaboration between CBOs and health institutions



HIV Infection among MSM in EECA – concentrated epidemic



Target groups

- Georgia MSM and TG
- Ukraine MSM and TG + sex workers and HIV-negative partners in discordant couples
- Moldova MSM and HIV-negative partners in discordant couples
- Armenia all
- Kazakhstan MSM and partners in discordant couples
- Kyrgyzstan MSM and partners in discordant couples, pending focus groups
- Russia MSM and discordant couples are being discussed



Service Models

Georgia and Ukraine

- Pilot projects 100 clients, Georgia roll-out to 250, Ukraine roll-out to 2,800
- Based in state healthcare institutions with involvement of community based organizations
- TDF/FTC generic, daily 1 pill
- Funding: donors (Georgia GF, Ukraine PEPFAR/CDC, roll-out under GF)

Armenia

- Target group all
- Self-funded by participants, 150 USD per year
- 6 participants

Moldova

4 participants

Total EECA

210 participants?




Normative basis

- Truvada and TDF/FTC generics are registered in all countries
 - In Russia only for treatment but can be used for 'scientific purposes' in pilot projects
- Clinical protocols for PrEP delivery are developed in the 3 countries already piloting PrEP: Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine
 - Ukraine: local protocol for the pilot project, WHO protocol for the roll-out
 - Armenia: not a protocol but a schematic short description of PrEP delivery in the MoH Guidelines on HIV Prevention and Treatment
- PrEP is part of the HIV National Strategy in 3 countries: Armenia, Georgia, and Moldova

Barriers

- Lack of information and knowledge in communities;
 the biggest obstacle
- No demand from potential clients
- Lack of commitment and support from health specialists and officials
- Limited funding
- Excessive medicalization
- Stigma and discrimination against the key populations
- Insufficient political and legislative support



Recommendations (1)

- Creating demand for PrEP in the communities
- Breaking myths and misconceptions about PrEP
- Strengthened advocacy for PrEP; a regional plan and partnership
- Introduction of PrEP into national HIV strategies, other documents guiding the HIV response
- Cross-border cooperation and experience exchange of community activists and health professionals



Recommendations (2)

- Technical support on PrEP planning and implementation to health officials, health professionals and NGOs
- Low-threshold and client-centered approach for PrEP implementation
- Addressing stigma and discrimination
- Integration of STI prevention and treatment in PrEP programs
